Judging Guidelines

1. All Judges need to read and learn the rules in the Tri-County Microd Rule book.
2. Judges, you are not there to watch the race, watch your corner and if possible - watch where the drivers are driving.
3. There should be no conversation between parents or pit crew members and the race judges while race is in progress.
4. If you did not see the cause of the caution, say so. DO NOT JUST GO WITH THE OTHER JUDGE. Use the Video Replay.
5. The car that made contact is NOT always the car that is at fault. Many times, the car that got hit was out of control or drove erratic prior to being hit. The hit was unavoidable and not the fault of the car that made contact. Sometimes the car that got hit caused the caution.
6. Look for any driver that is turning into another car and pushing car sideways. This happens more with Jr. Novice and Novice Classes.
7. The inside car does not always have the right-of-way. If the outside car has more than $\frac{3}{4}$ car (nose even with front roll bar) lead going into the corner, they have the right-of-way to the inside line on the corner. That car can cut down in front of the inside car and is NOT the cause of the caution.

The FLAGGER has the final say!
